## Principal's Message


It was great to welcome our new learners to our campuses in London and Birmingham studying on our Pearson HND Business and our Training and Development programmes, as well as our Staffordshire University franchised courses this autumn.

We were delighted to commence the BSc (Hons) Health & Social Care along with the Masters in Business Administration (MBA). The College now has some 1600 learners and we are maintaining a 90% success and retention rate. We are also proud to announce that the National Student Survey published recently, rated the College 95% overall for student satisfaction which is an outstanding achievement.

A number of our BA (Hons) Business Management top up students attended the Staffordshire University graduation on the 15th November 2022 which was a wonderful celebration of their success and a joyous occasion for the graduates and their families.

The year seems to have passed very quickly as we returned to normality with face to face teaching sessions on the College campuses. However, the year has also been tinged with some sadness by the passing of our Queen Elizabeth II.

On behalf of the College, I would like to wish those of you celebrating Christmas festivities a wonderful time and we are excited to welcome in the New Year and the challenges and opportunities is brings with it.



### What's happening in the Education Sector

#### The Autumn Statement - Implications for Education

Sadly, further education was offered no extra funding in Thursday's autumn statement despite pleas for more resources to relieve hikes in costs and staffing challenges. Forecasts by the Institute for Fiscal Studies had predicted that:

- total spending on adult education was already set to be 25 per cent lower in 2024-2025. This is critical for national development.
- it also calculated that per-student funding in colleges was already 15 per cent lower in real terms in 2021-22 than in 2020-21.

The good news is that at CECOS we are resilient, inventive and will continue to deliver great education opportunities for our learners despite government policy.

Like FE, the budget was relatively silent on HE. However, Research & Development funding will increase to £20bn in 2024-25. Critical for national development of course, and it's good to see the HE rich get richer!



It was better news for the schools sector, who will receive a £2.3 billion boost in 2023-24, and then again in 2024-25. The extra £4.6 billion will restore per pupil funding to 2010 levels in real terms, the government said. So good news for all you parents of school aged children.

#### Apprenticeship Funding

As if the failure to increase FE and HE funding wasn't disappointing enough, we now find out from the Treasury that more than £2 billion of unspent apprenticeship funding has been returned to treasury since 2018.



DFE to press ahead with defunding around 3,500 post-16 entry and level 2 VTQs

Following the sector consultation, the DfE says that it intends to go ahead with the proposals because 'the volume of such qualifications currently available is too complex for employers and students to navigate'. We will be reviewing this and how it impacts our FE provision.

Office for Students says HE providers could face fines if not enough of their graduates get graduate-level jobs

On 30 September, the OfS introduced new measures which could result in HE providers in England facing financial penalties of up to £500,000 unless at least: 75% of their full-time students studying for a first degree complete their course and 60% go on to higher study or into a professional level job within 15 months of graduating.

New report says that up to 300,000 poorer students urgently need additional financial support

Earlier this month, 'MillionPlus', an organisation that represents 'new' universities, published a report entitled 'Learning with the lights off: students and the cost of living'. The report says that around 300,000 of the poorest students 'desperately need additional financial support'. Responding, a DfE spokesperson signposted hardship related funding which is available through the OfS'.

Continued growth of international students coming to the UK to study

In 2020/21 there were a total of 605,130 international students studying in UK universities and colleges. This is the largest number on record and exceeds the target of recruiting 600,000 students by 2030 set by government. Of these students, 152,905 were from the EU and 452,225 were non-EU. Tuition fee income from non-EU students has also grown substantially, now making up 17% of UK universities' total income in 2020/21.

And finally...



What music is on your iPhone?


Taylor Swift, Ariana Grande, OK Kanmani- Indian album.
