Since 2018 we have expanded the College, from 4 rooms in South Woodford to 17 Rooms in Edmonton Green, 9 rooms in Birmingham and our Bradford campus due to open in September 2023. None of this would have been possible without the dedication and hard work for our staff members and of course, our students. I thank you all.

Our students play a large part in our development and expansion. We have a successful Student Council, which has been a crucial means for quick dissemination of information and for providing immediate feedback on events which occur in the classes and across the College. Thank you to all our



student Council representatives for making this possible and being an effective channel for sharing information.

Along the way, I do not want to lose sight of the importance of your learning journey and experiences during your time at CECOS. This is different for each of you, but we would like to ensure a safe and pleasant learning environment for all. This is not something the College can provide without the cooperation of our students.

We have developed and put in place a number of policies to help maintain a level of order and safety. I would just like to recap these measures and explain their importance.

Arriving on time

We have condensed the teaching times as much as possible to ensure that you can reap the benefits of being a full time students and, balance your study and outside commitments. A prompt start to classes means we keep within Funding College guidelines whilst also allowing time for discussions and for a recap at the end of each session. This could make the difference between a pass or higher grade in your assignments.

Wearing you ID Card

Due to the location of our campuses, in some cases it has been easy for people to enter who are not registered with us. Both the CECOS and University lanyards are bright and easily noticeable, so that the College can ensure that only staff and students who belong on campus are making use of our facilities. Staff will challenge anyone without a visible ID card.

You can also expect staff to have a burgundy lanyard whilst on campus.



Don't let people that you do not recognise tailgate you onto campus during in the evening or weekend hours. This risks your safety and that of your fellow students.

Informing Reception

We all have emergencies to deal with from time to time, and we appreciate that a lot of you are parents or have caring responsibilities. We do not want to make uninformed decisions regarding students who leave early, so let the reception know so that it can be noted. If it is on a regular basis, a meeting can be set up with Student Support staff to discuss how the timetable can be changed to allow you to attend full sessions.

Communicate

If you are facing any difficulties, please let us know.

You can have a confidential conversation with Student Support staff or contact me. We would like you to continue and complete your studies once you have started, so by speaking to us about anything which is going to effect your attendance or engagement, we can try to help. This could be with a modified timetable or break in studies.

Work will commence in the next month and we hope to start delivering courses from mid-2023 onwards.

We have witnessed a significant growth in demand for our provision in London. The opening of a second campus in the Stepney Green will allow us to meet the increased demand. Our Stepney Green campus will consist of two closely situated buildings which will also have 5 learning areas, including a combination of classrooms and IT suites.

Work on the campus is scheduled to be completed in July 2023 and we hope to commence delivery of programmes on site from September 2023.

Wellbeing Areas

Staff and student welfare is a prime consideration at CECOS College. We are therefore proud to confirm that we offer refreshment/kitchen areas on all of our campuses, together with a breakout room and a non-denominational prayer room. · Career Mentorship Programme

We organise a mentorship programme that pairs students with successful professionals in their field, giving them valuable advice and guidance as they navigate their careers.

· Networking and Job Fair

FE SNAPSHOT

As we enter springtime we can reflect on a very busy period within FE in both the North of Tyne and West Yorkshire regions. From cohorts successfully making the grade to welcoming new students and classes into the College in 2023; it's been a time of both achievement and renewal.



So far this academic year in West Yorkshire alone, we have supported 316 learners to undertake an accumulative 497 courses. Around 75% of our learners are resident in some of the most disadvantaged wards of this region. We remain very proud of the impact our team is having across the diverse communities within both the North Tyne and West Yorkshire areas.

North East Learner of the Month Robert Bari

Robert first joined CECOS College in September 2022, when he enrolled onto an ESOL Speaking and Listening course in Newcastle Upon Tyne. Robert has already progressed onto the next level of his studies with CECOS. Robert is so committed to improving his English; he chooses to attend additional classes with CECOS to develop his speaking and listening skills.

When Robert first arrived with us, he was a quiet learner who preferred working alone, but, as the weeks passed, he came out of his shell and opened up more. He barely spoke a word to anyone in class to begin with. However, now he is known as "teacher Robert" and helps out a lot during class with translating and working 1-2-1 with other students, alongside the lecturer. He motivates students and likes to give examples to his peers by writing on the whiteboard, telling jokes and stories from his own experiences. Robert is a student who, if anyone, needs any extra support, they can find a willing peer in Robert.

Robert has confirmed that he really enjoys coming to ESOL class and has even started joining in the Functional Skills English course for extra revision! Robert is going the extra mile with his learning and is always a keen learner in class. This is evidenced both through his work and 100% attendance for all classes in Newcastle. His goal for the future is to complete his ESOL and progress onto Functional Skills English and Maths, and to eventually gain a managerial role within the cleaning sector, managing others and motivating them to achieve their goals.

The learner was a victim of domestic violence and suffered depression. As a consequence she was reluctant to start the course and then decided she needed to do something for herself and for her community.




