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Principal's Message

As we come to the end of another hugely successful year for CECOS College, we would like to acknowledge the fantastic efforts made by all staff in transitioning back from online to classroom based learning, ensuring our student experience is the very best it can be at all times – thank you all! And all of this whilst continuing to grow our student number base to 1,311 HE students and 1,050 FE students, which will continue to rise until the end of the year.

It is good to have all our students back in the College, participating in lessons and meeting socially around the campus. The College has a real buzz about it, and our nine lecture rooms and three IT suites are now fully utilised 7 days a week. We are currently developing additional lecture rooms and student facilities in the centre opposite the College, as we prepare for further expansion of both our Further and Higher education provision.

This year, we also opened our new Birmingham Campus in Digbeth opposite the 2022 Commonwealth Games site which is only 10 minutes from New Street Station and the Bullring, ensuring students can get to us easily. Based on three floors there are nine lecture rooms and two IT suites, along with a library and multifaith prayer room.

The FE team have continued to grow their provision, through some excellent partnership working with local authorities. I would particularly like to recognise their excellent work with the West Yorkshire and North Tyneside combined authorities.

Both contracts have delivered against all student number targets and most importantly, they have achieved very high levels of positive progression into employment. A significant number of our students have found work in the Health & Social Care sectors, making a positive contribution in an areas of national skills shortages. To complement all of this the team will be introducing a new level 3 Bridging Course, as a progression pipeline programme for our own Bachelors degree in Health & Social Care.

The FE team have also been busy with working on all aspects of quality, as they look to a potential Ofsted visit next academic year. Bev has been working hard on the development of new Self Assessment Report (SAR) and Quality Improvement Plan (QIP) templates, and the management team will all be contributing to their development at the July workshop. Gulshad has been reviewing the lesson observation system to make it more supportive and impactful for colleagues. Sarah is supporting our quality journey with improvements in data capture and reporting. She is currently working to ensure all attendance data is captured in PICS so we can benefit from better and more timely attendance reporting.

There will be an 'all FE staff' team meeting to update staff and share our strategic direction, along with key challenges for the coming year. This will also give staff the opportunity to ask questions of the management team.



Our partnership with Staffordshire University continues to develop and grow.

We are now recruiting for the a BSc (Hons) in Health and Social Care degree with a foundation year alongside the BA (Hons) in Business and Sustainability which is proving very successful and popular.

The Business top up degree continues to produce outstanding results with the recent cohort achieving 5 first class; 42 upper second and 29 lower second degrees and students will attend the graduation in July at the University. This is a great result we are so proud of our graduates.

I'd also like to congratulate Dr Rhyddhi Chakraborty, who will be taking up the position of Programme Leader for our new BSc in Health and Social Care.



Higher and Further Education Sector Updates

In September 2022 we start delivery of the BSc (Hons) Health & Social Care with foundation year as well as a Masters in Business Administration (MBA) which we are also really excited about. In addition, our great FE team have extended the wide range of programmes they offer from our London, Leeds and Newcastle Campuses and there are more details in this edition of the newsletter.

Looking more widely across our sector:



- The Government's Higher Education (Freedom of Speech) Bill 2021 will change the way that universities and students' unions work to protect freedom of speech and academic freedom across the higher education sector. It also seeks to ensure people are supported to get the skills they need throughout their life via the Lifelong Loan Entitlement. This will provide a new and flexible way of providing loan support for post-18 study. Individuals will be able to access a loan entitlement to help them pay for the equivalent of four years of post-18 education that they can use over their lifetime for a range of studies, including shorter and technical courses.
- In April, after 11 months of fierce debate in both Houses of Parliament, the Skills and Post-16 Education Bill was enacted into law. The government says that the new Act underpins the transformation of post-16 education and skills as set out in the Skills for Jobs White Paper and will help level up and drive growth across the whole country. Employers will be placed at the heart of the skills system so that the training on offer meets the needs of local areas and people 'no longer have to leave their hometowns to find a good job'.
- The Education and Training Foundation (ETF) has published an updated version of its 'Professional Standards for teachers and trainers in the Further Education and Training sector in England'. The updated standards were developed in consultation with a wide range of organisations and practitioners and, says the ETF, are 'part of its commitment to supporting the sector, and developing the expertise and professionalism of teachers, trainers and leaders'.
- A report published by the Office for Students (OfS) reveals that degree inflation is continuing to spiral. In the summer of 2021, almost four in ten (37.9%) university graduates were awarded a first-class honours degree and more than eight in ten (84.4%) were awarded either a first or an upper-second class honours degree. The proportion of graduates achieving a first-class degree has more than doubled since 2011, and the OfS has expressed concerns that the sustained unexplained increase in degree grades awarded since then is undermining public confidence.

I would like to finish by congratulating all our learners on their success and as importantly the staff at the college, who all played a very big part in ensuring student achievements improved yet again this year. THANK YOU AGAIN FROM THE Senior management team.



HE Updates - BTECH Higher National Certificate & Diploma in Business



1. Responding to Student Feedback

CECOS College London ensures that students' responses and suggestions are implemented and effective changes are made that enhance students' experiences and benefit them appropriately. As a result a number of opportunities were provided for social interactions and various outdoor excursions for students and staff organised. This includes day trips to Sky Gardens, the British Library, the National Gallery and Durdle Door, a beauty spot on the coast in Dorset..



2. Outstanding Achievement

Students make substantial efforts to engage with their course which is reflected in their achievement records. CECOS College London believes that students' engagement is closely connected with their academic achievement. Hence, a significant amount of time and effort is being placed on enhancing their experience through academic support. This includes tutorial support, study skills sessions and enhancing the class room learning environment.

The efforts invested in maintaining academic standards are evident through students' outstanding achievement records for HN programmes. HNC and HND students' achievement rate is 92% to 96% and additionally, 99% students remain engaged with their courses. Students' engagement with their subjects and achievement records demonstrate that students develop critical thinking, interpersonal and contemporary employability skills during their course of studies



Education and Teaching/Training Programme Update

DET programme is proving popular on both our London and Birmingham campuses with around 400 students and 22 staff supporting delivery across both sites campuses. The DET team and support staff have a central focus on the care and well-being of the students including their opportunities to fulfil all aspects of assessment requirements. Staff are also engaged in ensuring they keep up their professional development including undertaking the IQA Assessor course, and following up fellowship opportunities with other academic and professional bodies which offer opportunities to facilitate and enhance opportunities for our students. Our DET Team proudly celebrated the Queen's Platinum Jubilee representing a wide diversity of different commonwealth nations, and were joined by staff from across the College.



We are also proud to announce that one of our lecturers, Mr Ali Gohar, presented the following two research papers as part of the 14th annual International Conference on Education and New Learning Technologies (EDULEARN22) held in Palma de Mallorca (Spain) on the 4-6th of July 2022.

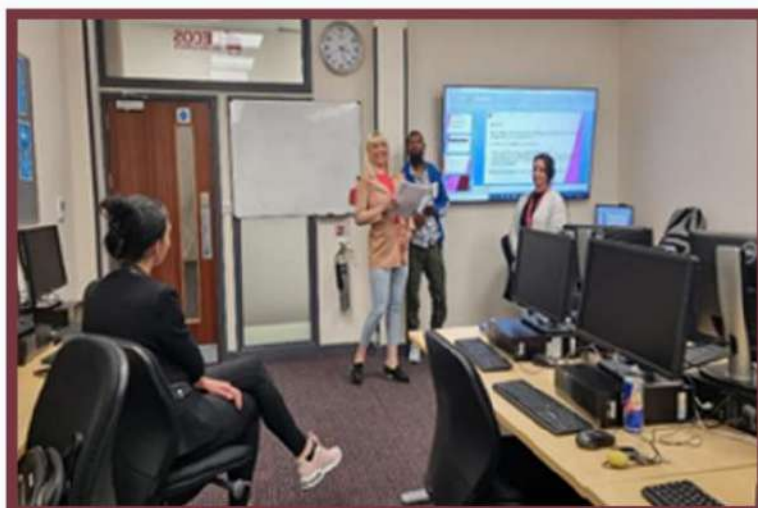
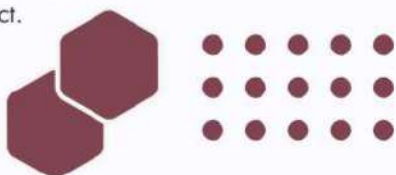

BA (Hons) Business Management & Sustainability & BA Top Up News

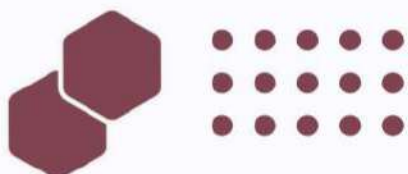

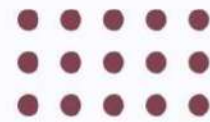

Finally our congratulations to the BA (Hons) Business Top Up students who completed their programme in June with a remarkable 5 students achieving a first class degree, 45 students achieving an upper second class degree and 29 students achieving a lower second. Students will be graduating in July at Staffordshire University, and we hope to see some of them return to College in the autumn to continue their studies by progressing to the New Masters in Business Administration (Marketing Pathway) programme.



FE Update - WYCA (West Yorkshire)

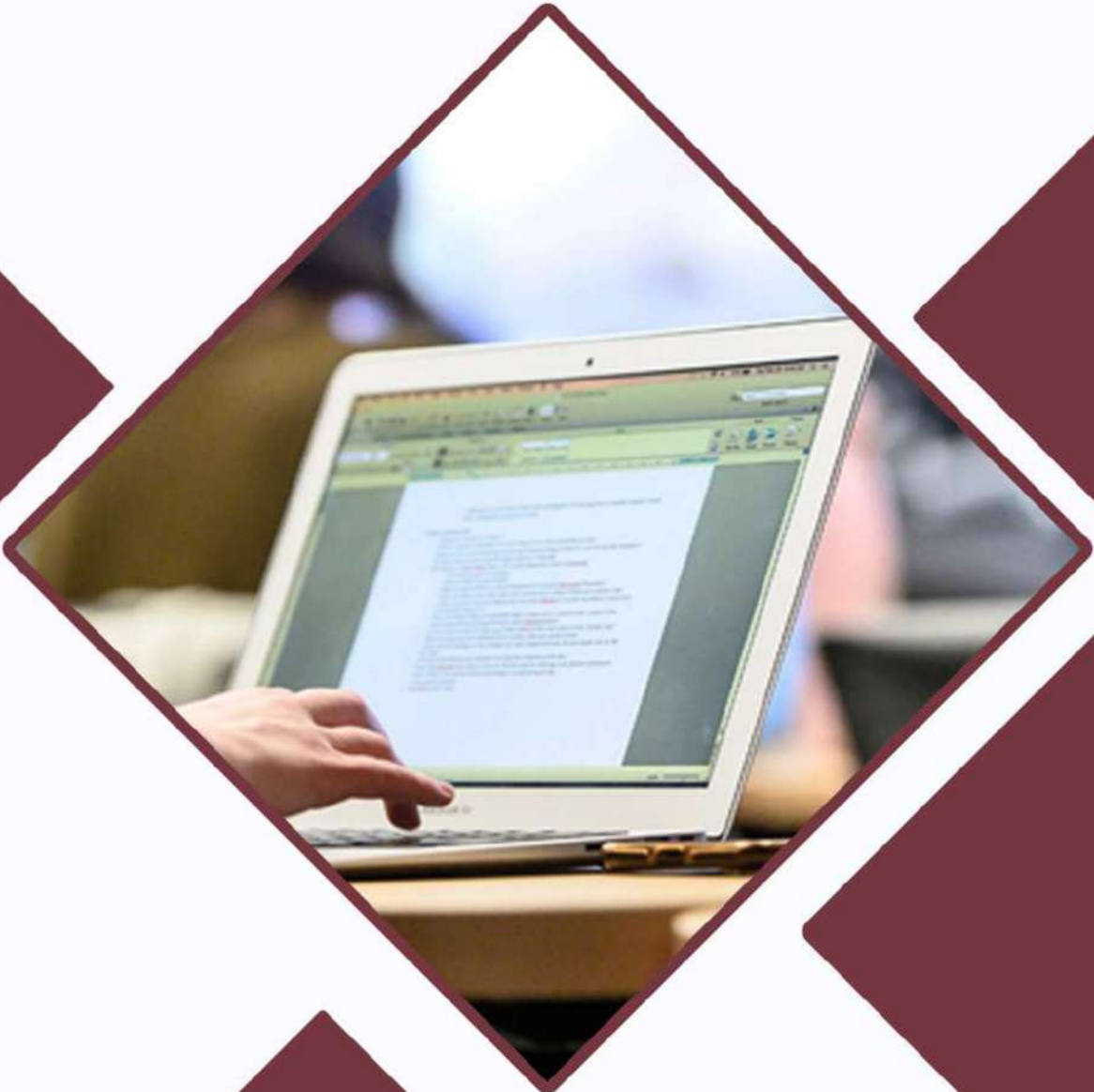


Leading the Way in the Digital Revolution

Spring and early summer has seen CECOS College roll out, and increased the volume of uptake in Essential Digital Skills Entry Level 3 and Level 1 across West Yorkshire. Identified by the **Combined Authority** as a key skills gap, we have been delivering the provision in our Leeds centre and community centres across Bradford, Wakefield and Batley.

This course enables learners to utilise a variety of devices to search for accurate information, formatting text and how to manage their digital footprint.

We compliment this offer by also running the Level 2 IT Professional diploma which is a potential progression route for learners.

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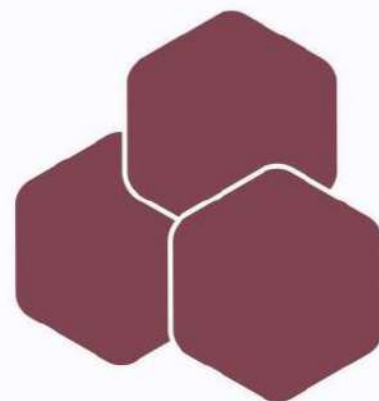
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The Alumni Group Klaudia – One Year On

Klaudia let us know that she has achieved first class grades and entry into her second year!!!

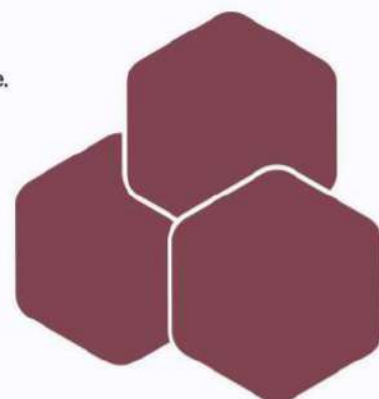
Klaudia once again expressed her gratitude to the staff at CECOS College.

CECOS are working in partnership with Professional Training Solutions (PTS) to deliver a Greater London Authority (GLA) contract, through the Adult Education Budget (AEB) entitled Good Work for All.

GLA AEB Good Work for All is the Mayor of London's recovery programme.

The purpose of the Good Work for All programme is to put in place additional provision and activities funded through the AEB budget, to provide Londoners most affected by the pandemic with the skills to help them access new and appropriate work opportunities.



The programme CECOS College London are delivering is aimed at individuals who live in London and are:

- Employed in the Health and Social Care or Childcare sector and keen to update their CPD to support sustainable employment and progression.
- Unemployed individuals who are eager gain employment or progress to Further/Higher education in the Health & Social Care & Childcare sector.

These programmes also match skills shortage areas in Greater London, where currently there are high numbers of vacancies.

- Level 2 Certificate in the Principles of Dementia Care
- Level 2 Certificate in the Principles of Working with Individuals with Learning Disabilities
- Level 2 Certificate in the Principles of Prevention and Control of Infection in Health Care Settings.

12. What music is on your iPhone?

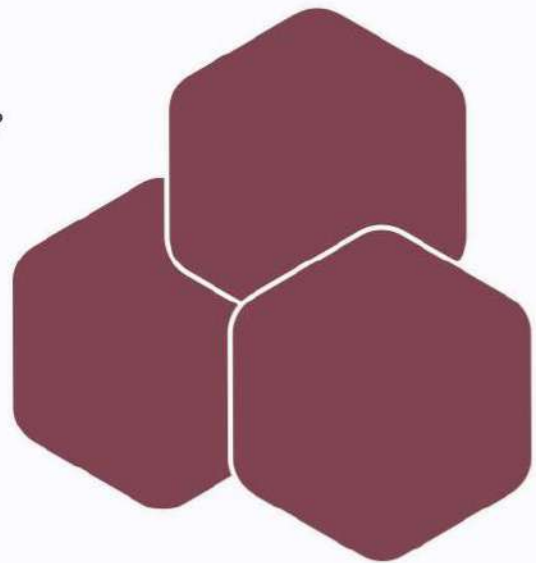
My music varies from all different mixes but I prefer things that are catchy.

2. What has been the happiest and proudest moment of your life?

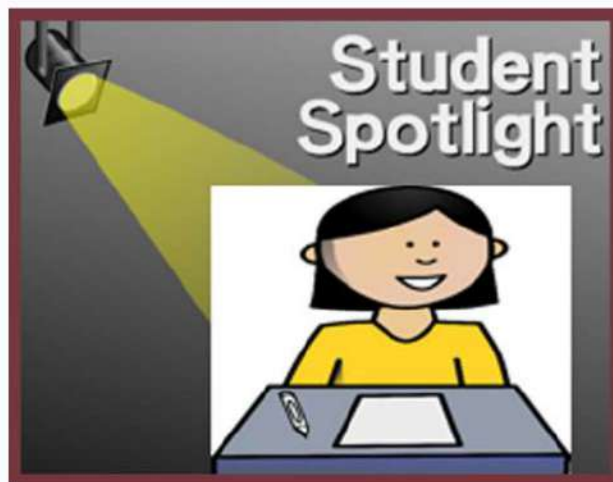
I guess for me that is being healthy and happy.

10. What has been your greatest challenge as part of your studies?

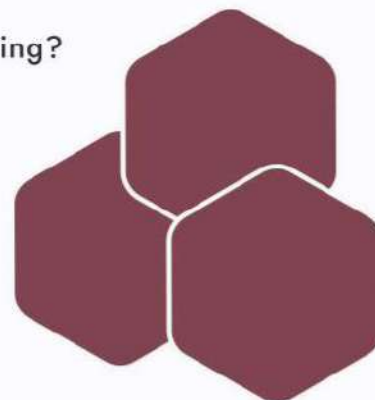

My Student Journey by: Alia Khan



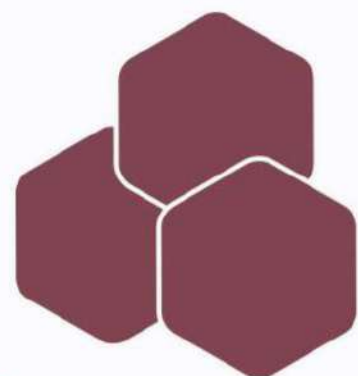
